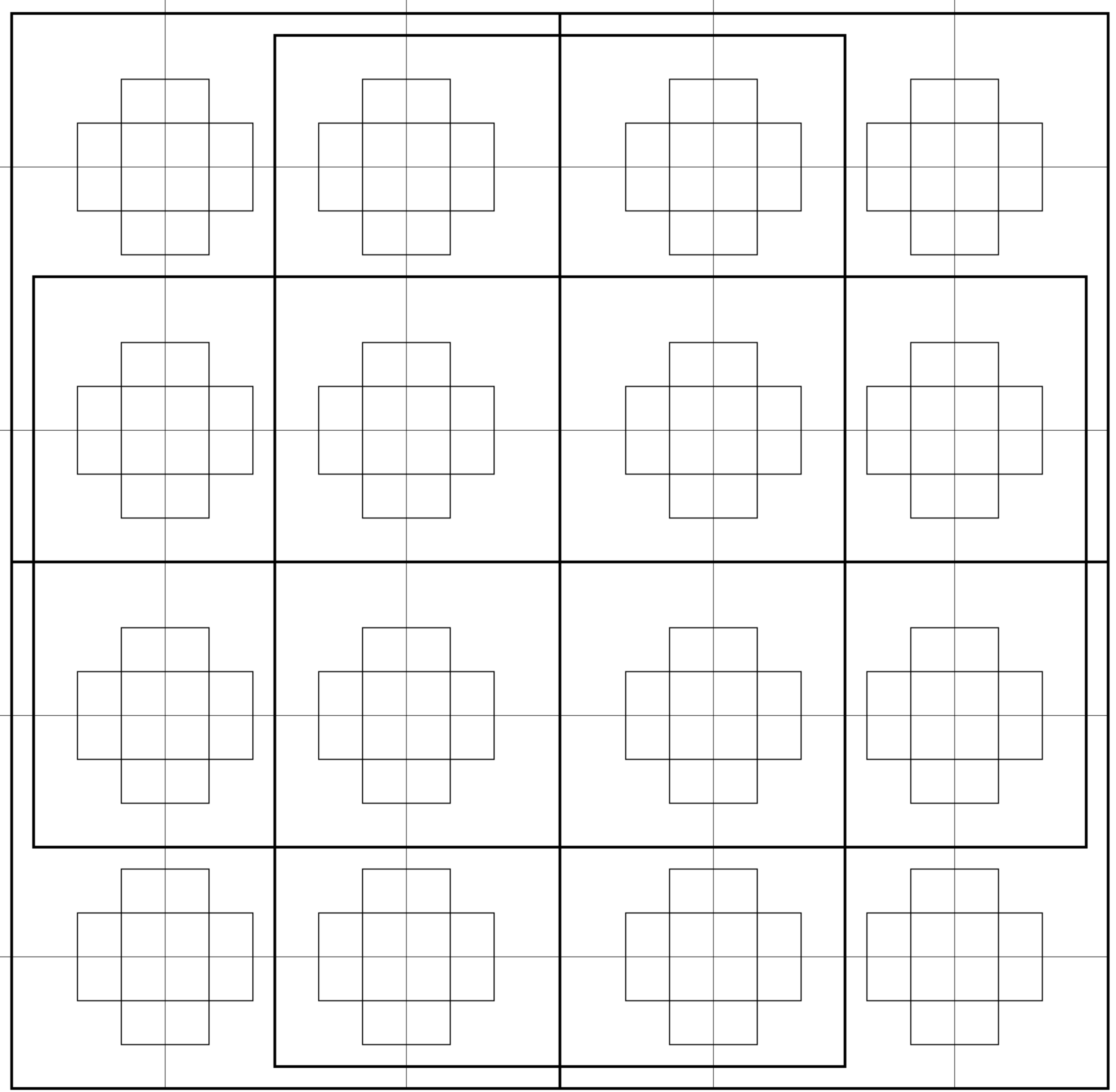
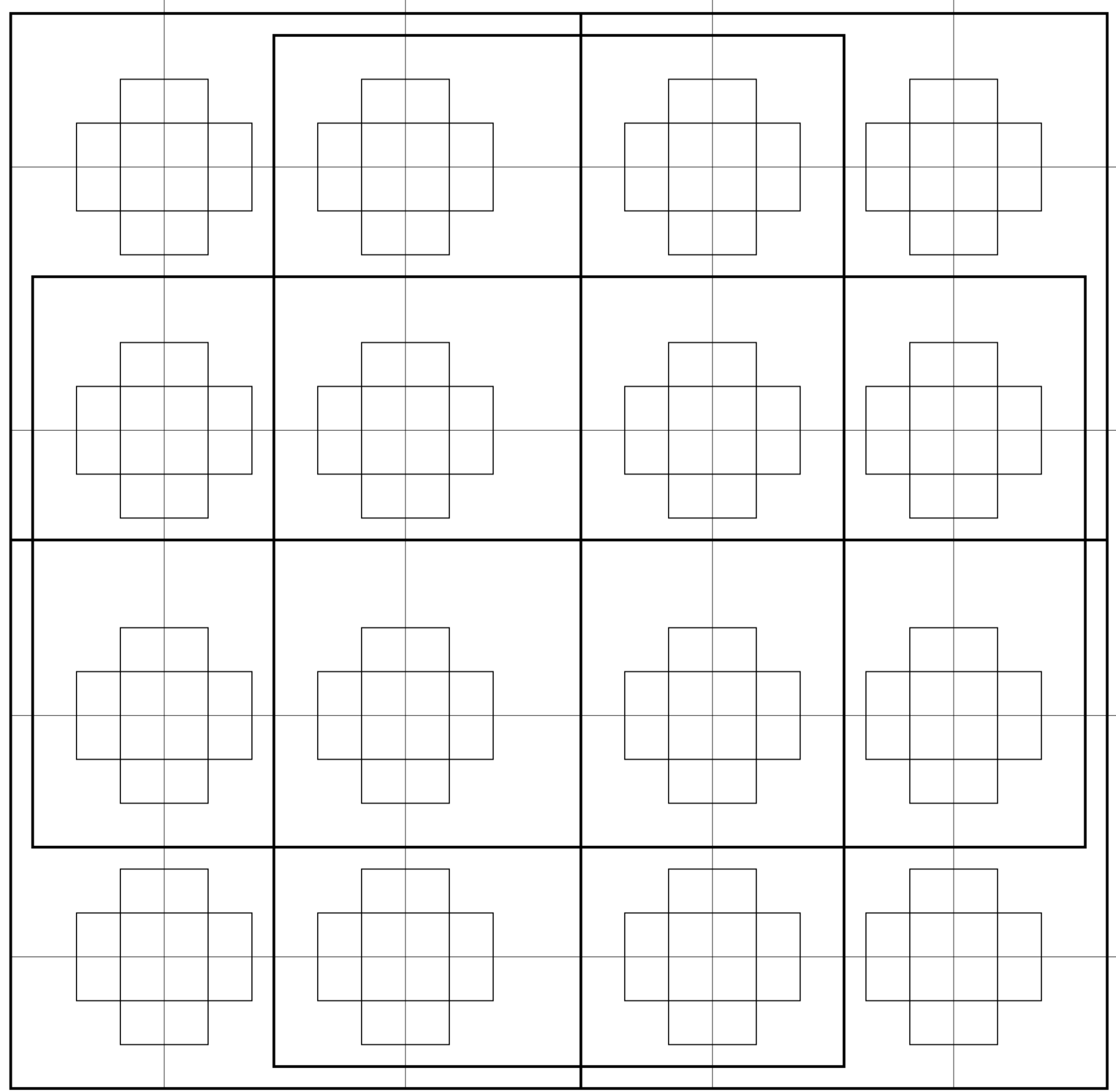
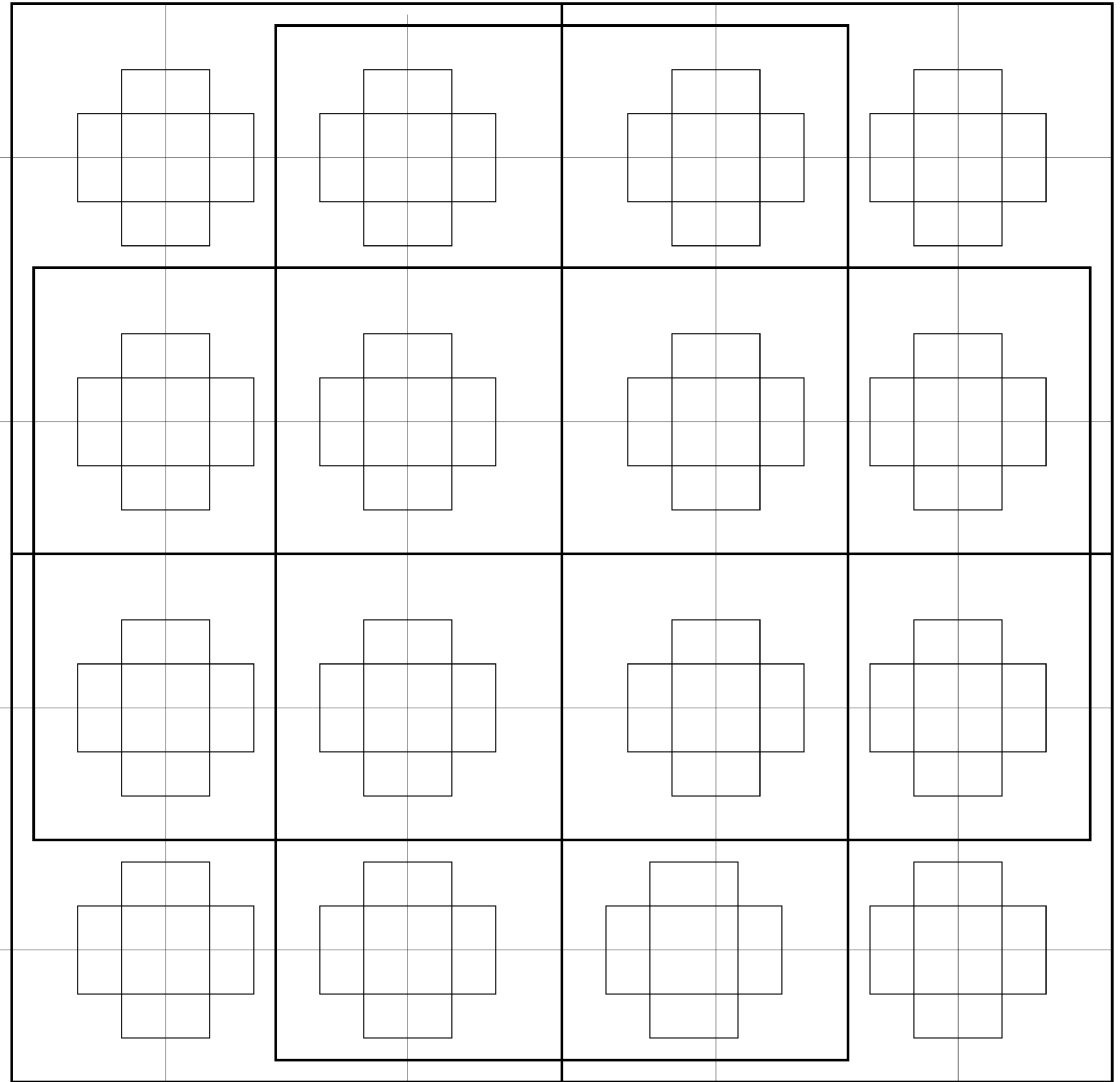
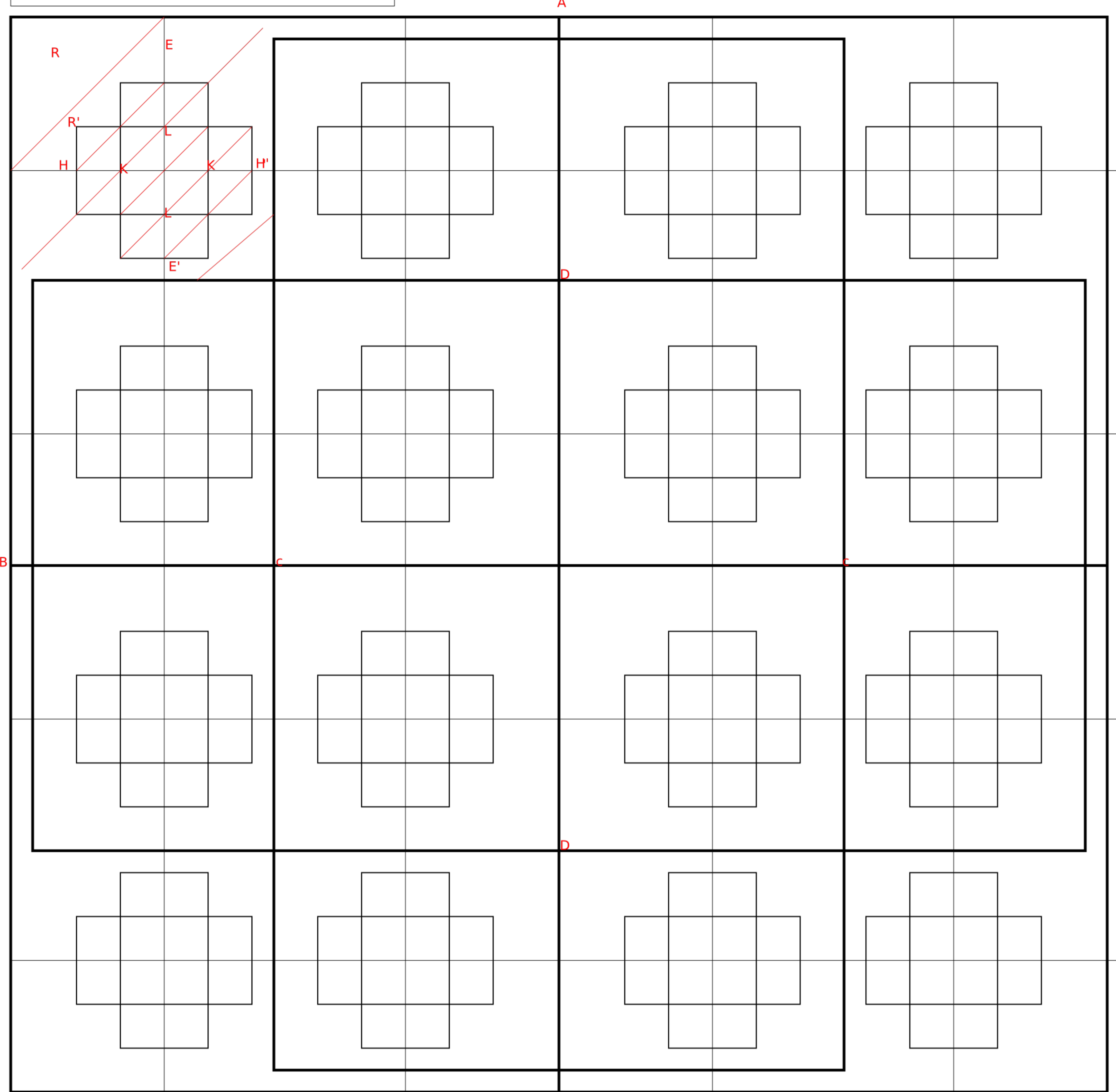


Universal: Men

1. A Logician, who eats pork-chops for supper, will probably lose money; **BMK**
2. A Gambler, whose appetite is not ravenous, will probably lose money; **CH'K**
3. A Man who is depressed, having lost money and being likely to lose more, always rises at 5 AM; **L'EKD**
4. A Man, who neither gambles nor eats pork-chops for supper, is sure to have a ravenous appetite; **C'B'H**
5. A Lively Man, who goes to bed before 4 AM, had better take to cab-driving; **LR'N**
6. A Man with a ravenous appetite, who has not lost money and does not rise at 5 AM, always eats pork-chops for supper; **HE'D'B**
7. A Logician, who is in danger of losing money, had better take to cab-driving; **BKN**

8. An Earnest Gambler, who is depressed though he has not lost money, is in no danger of losing any; **ACL'E'K'**
9. A Man, who does not gamble, and whose appetite is not ravenous, is always lively; **C'H'L**
10. A Lively Logician, who is really in earnest, is in no danger of losing money; **LMAK'**
11. A Man with a ravenous appetite has no need to take to cab-driving if he is really in earnest; **HAN', HA'N**
12. A Gambler, who is depressed though in no danger of losing money, is up 'till 4 AM; **CL'K'R**
13. A Man, who has lost money and does not eat pork-chops for supper, had better take to cab-driving, unless he gets up at 5 AM; **EB'ND', EB'N'D**
14. A Gambler, who goes to bed before 4 AM, need not take to cab-driving unless he has a ravenous appetite. **CR'N'H', CR'HN**
